Action Updates

Most of our focus and time over the past two months has been on ensuring that as many people across the island were aware of the Government plans to fast track fracking by making exploration



wells Permitted Development and including production wells under the Nationally Significant Infrastructure Project regime.

This meant a four pronged action.

- 1. Creating documents for emailing to each Isle of Wight Councillor and parish and town councillors to raise awareness of the issues and asking them to **object** as a council and through the public consultations.
- 2. Planning street leafleting for public awareness, during September and October in Newport, Cowes, Ryde and Shanklin and providing weblinks for the public to complete the consultations from our website.
- 3. Attending Cabinet and Council meetings to put questions to councillors about their views on the government's plans to fast track fracking.
- 4. Raising awareness through the media.

September 19th - We held a peaceful demonstration outside the Council Building and



we were delighted that **the council voted unanimously against Permitted Development.**See press coverage in the **Observer** and **County Press** on line

National Protest & Petitions Across England

The last two months have seen a rise in parliamentary debate, campaigns and protest across England and the UK against new planning for and drilling of fracking wells, oil & gas industry injunctions against peaceful protest, the imprisonment of peaceful protestors and action for climate change.

Over 30,000 people have signed petitions against fast tracking fracking and, at the time of writing 1,163 people have signed the IOW **Petition Against Drilling in Arreton.**Click on the link if you would also like to sign it.

After the imprisonment of the Preston New Road Three a new petition was opened by 38 degrees calling for an **Inquiry into the Right to Protest.**Click on the link if you would also like to sign it.
